We C.A.R.E. Scratch Story Creation Competition

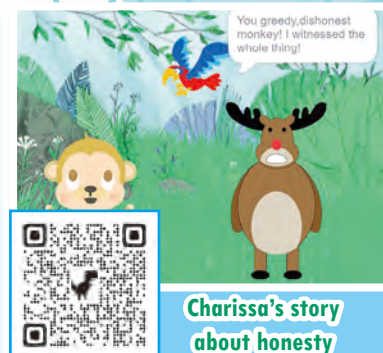

We C.A.R.E. Parents' Sharing: Empathy

(2A Taliyah Chan's Parent)

Empathy is an emotional phenomenon that can be understood as being able to perceive the feelings and emotions of others, which in turn provokes compassionate actions and positive outcomes. Empathy doesn't come naturally. It can be taught, developed and reinforced through our actions, starting from early childhood.

As parents, we should always try to empathize with our children even if we don't see eye to eye. Children are unique gifts from God and we need to acknowledge their individuality. At times, they may not understand or feel the way other people are feeling. We need to reassure them that it is normal to feel differently. When others hold different viewpoints, we should refrain from yelling as this would hinder communications. Instead, we should encourage our children to identify and recognize their own emotions, letting them know that it is okay to feel certain ways, even if it differs from their peers.

Interactions promote connections and creativity plays a key role pertaining to establishing connection opportunities. One way to develop empathy is to have our children participate in perspective-taking dialogues so that they may learn how to build and communicate empathic skills. Perspective-taking dialogues elicit a range of cognitive reasoning, thereby helping children to better understand the emotions and perspectives of others. We may further enhance our children's empathic capacity by positive feedback and reinforcement, offering guidance and support to help them develop empathy for those less fortunate.

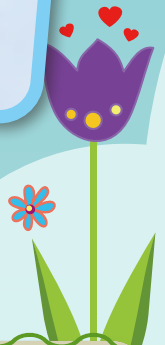

An adventure with Stitch

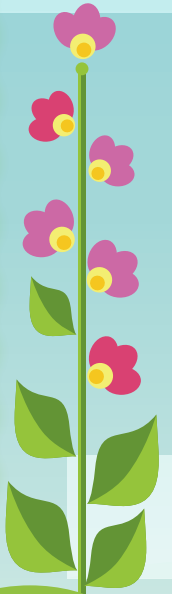
A month ago, I went on an adventure with Stitch. Let me tell you what we did.

The next morning, I got up and found I was normal again. I am not a tiny mouse anymore! It is definitely not easy to be a mouse.

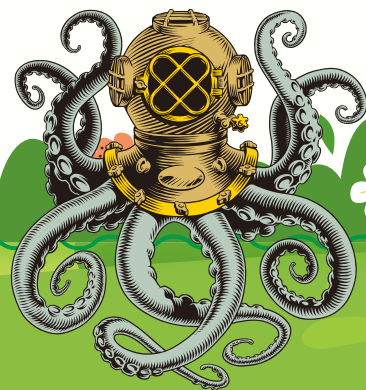


Misty Forest
