Primary 6 Students Dive into Fascinating Oceans on RTHK Radio

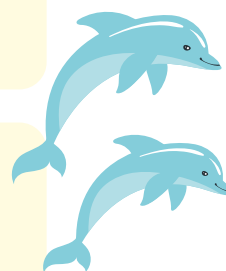

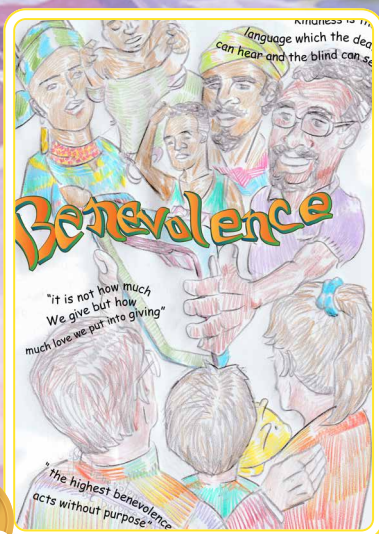
BENEVOLENCE, LAW-ABIDINGNESS & COMMITMENT

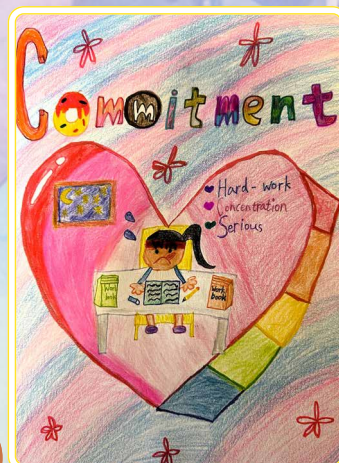

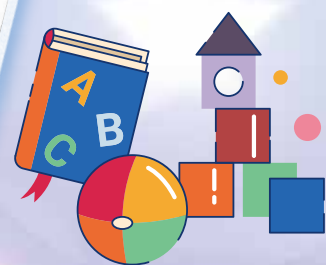
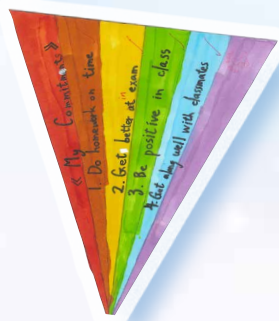
