## ABOUT THE PROGRAMME...



The school successfully obtained a grant under the "Promoting Effective English Language Learning in Primary Schools Grant Scheme" (PEEGS) initiated by SCOLAR (EDB) to develop this school-based language programme. The programme aims to arouse students' interest in reading and provide them with more opportunities to use English in an authentic way.
